Prospective bidders are bidding on the following lot/item #501:

One lot consisting of 17,956 pounds of: Once fired (mixed), spent lead ammunition (the “Lot”). The Lot may include a small percentage (%) of non-lead material such as brass casings and shot-gun husk. The majority of the spent lead is from .40 caliber ammunition. Approximately 25% will be from 5.56 rifle cartridges and a small percentage will be other various pistol calibers. The total weight of the Lot is approximately 17,956 pounds and is contained in 8 Industrial sacks, 5, 30-Gallon Drums, and 4, 55-Gallon Steel Drums. The containers are included as part of the sale of the Lot. The successful bidder must ensure that transport of the Lot from the government facility is in accordance with any applicable U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) regulations. Therefore, the lead may need to be transferred from the industrial sacks to DOT-approved containers and/or may require transport by an appropriately licensed hauler. CBP will require a copy of the transportation manifest.

Inspection and/or removal: Of the Lot is by appointment only. All prospective bidders must provide the property custodian, Jack Evangelista, at 619-690-7735, at least twenty-four (24) hours of notice prior to expected arrival date. Inspection hours are (except federal holidays), M-F 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 PDT.
